






THE PROGRAM



The Tasmanian Youth Local Government program aims to empower its participants to engage with local issues, represent their community and collaborate on policy ideas. Nominees from each region will come together with representatives from around the state to debate social and development issues whilst gaining worthwhile experience in community consultation.

The program will focus on the power of grassroots advocacy, combining workshops, speakers' panels, and group discussions to provide a rewarding and welcoming environment for young councilors to discuss what is most important to them.

Participants of this program will produce submissions and project proposals, which will be presented to Councillors at the program's conclusion, with the hopes that some of these proposals may be adopted by local governments throughout our state.

Throughout this process, the participants will develop public speaking, planning and problem solving skills that will allow them to contribute in their schools and communities, and provide them with the confidence, and necessary skills to stand up as advocates for the issues they believe in. Not only that, the program will connect participants with like-minded people to form friendships and collectively contribute to a stronger community, whereby young people can feel that they are being heard by those that represent them.

HOW YOU CAN HELP



WHAT CAN YOUR LOCAL COUNCIL DO?

We're aiming for wide representation and involvement, to increase youth engagement in regional areas and to strengthen youth connections to community. We want to make the Youth Local Government experience as engaging and realistic as possible. Therefore, we aim to have students from each municipality represented - your support could help make this a reality.

We hope that councilors will accompany the nominees and contribute to the program meaningfully.

Benefits to the community and local government include:

- High impact sponsorship for young leaders with fresh perspectives.
- Opportunities for community consultation.
- Improving the image of local government.
- Feedback on reform areas and issues of relevance to Tasmania.
- Intergenerational learning for all participants.

HOW YOUR LOCAL STUDENTS CAN GET INVOLVED

We are running a restricted application process for Tasmanian Local Youth Government, unlike any of our other conferences. We are opening registrations to two students from each Local Government to ensure that all areas are represented.

Who is eligible for application:

Students attending school in grades 9 or 10.

When is the conference:

Northern/North West Round: Saturday 30th of September and Sunday 1st of October.

Southern Round: Saturday 8th of October and Sunday 9th of October.

Residential Weekend in the South: Saturday 14th of October and Sunday 15th of October.

Where will the conference be held:

This is yet to be confirmed but will be advised as soon as possible. However, we can ensure that each round will be held in a central area to ensure accessibility for students from an array of backgrounds and geographical locations.

The Cost:

The cost associated with this conference is \$90 per student. This will cover the accommodation and all meals on the residential weekend. Tasmanian Youth Government Association aim to keep costs as low as possible to ensure accessibility for all students.

The application Process:

We would like each council to advertise this opportunity to schools within their municipality in order to seek interested students. Each council would then select two students to represent their local area. We see this as the best way to ensure all areas are equally represented. This is also a fantastic way to create a communication avenue with students in your local area. These students will then report back to your council with the topical areas discussed at camp and the main areas identified that need reform.

Once each council has selected their student representatives, the relative forms and information will be sent to the individual students to prepare them for camp.

We would love to keep a constant stream of communication with you to ensure each council has student representatives. We would suggest that if your council has a youth officer or councilor that takes a particular interest in youth activities in your area we would love to be put in contact with them to ensure your local government is able to make the most of this worthwhile opportunity.
