Greater Esk Tourism gained funding from the Urban Renewal and Heritage Fund (Tasmanian Government), FRRR (Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal), Tasmanian Community Fund, Fahcsia Volunteer Grants 2010, Arts Tasmania and the Northern Midlands Council to restore and develop the old Avoca State School building into the Avoca Museum and Information Centre at the gateway to the Fingal Valley. The project was also supported by the Tasmanian Heritage Council, Heritage Tasmania, Northern Tasmanian Development, the Heritage Highway Association and Break O'Day Council.

Avoca is situated on the Esk Highway, 25 km east of Conara, approximately 50 minutes from Launceston and the airport. It is a charming village with a Roadhouse, Post Office, Museum and Information Centre, the Cow Shed ice-creamery, several historical buildings and a pleasant picnic and camping area on the banks of the St Pauls River. Avoca township planned in 1833 and proclaimed in 1866.
